
GOD WITH US

All throughout Scripture, there are whispers of the promised restoration through the coming Messiah. Israel waited for this promise. Little did they know that salvation would come in a lowly manger. Christ would come to conquer both sin and death in a way no one expected, opening up the door to restoration with the Father. Restoration is a beautiful thing.

And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you. - 1 Peter 5:10

Peter closes out his letter to the scattered Christians in the churches of Asia Minor with some final instructions. He counsels the elders about how to lead, includes how and why to live in humility for the glory of Christ.

In the midst of brokenness, failures, sin, mistakes, and hurts that are experienced in this world, Jesus restores. To restore literally means to bring back, return, and recover, put back in order, and to adjust back together.

Peter then addresses all Christians with this, "Put on humility toward each other out of submission to God." God is God, and we are not. We are to humble ourselves under His hand, understanding that our only significance is found in Him. We can freely stop promoting ourselves, because He will exalt us, when the time is exactly right.

When Jesus restores you, you always turn out better than you ever were. You may have scars that show what you have been through, but they are only a testimony of God's love and power.

Examine your heart:

Restoration of the relationship between you and God through Jesus, is His work. Your role is humble submission. Your responsibility is to trust Emmanuel, God with us. He is faithful.

Have you placed your faith in the saving work of Jesus? Where do you need Jesus to bring restoration?

Heavenly Father, you sent your messengers to tell of the birth of your Son, that people might believe in him. Open our ears to hear your call, to repent of our sins, and to seek you in humility. We trust in your work on the Cross of Christ as our only hope for restoration. We love you with all of our hearts. AMEN.
